WHEN TO DO A CALENDAR LISTING:

- A calendar listing is a short, concise announcement for a local chapter activity that is written to target consumers. Remember to include all important details, including date, time and event theme.
- ☑ The following is a roadmap of when to send out a calendar listing:
 - Newspapers: Calendar listings should be sent to daily newspaper calendar editors
 one month (and again at three weeks) prior to the event to allow them ample time
 to include the announcement in their round-up.
 - Magazines: When submitting calendar listings to a magazine, be aware of the
 publications editorial calendar. Most weekly/bi-weekly regional magazines
 include local calendar listings which should be submitted to the proper editor up
 to six weeks prior to your activity.
 - o **Radio/Television:** Radio and television stations may include your activity in a community calendar round-up. The calendar listing should be submitted to the proper producer up to three weeks prior to your activity.
 - Online Media: Online media may also include your activity in a community calendar round-up. The calendar listing should be submitted to the proper editor up to three weeks prior to your activity.
